For 'Starter' and 'Medium+' packages our servers are located in Germany as we are using a hosting service provided by Hetzner Online GmbH. For 'On demand packages' we might have on premise hosting or another hosting service provider as imposed by the contractual obligations we have with our partners and Subscribers on a case by case situation.
